


# LANE COUNTY AT A GLANCE



## EMPLOYMENT BREAKDOWN



Lane County is the fourth most populous county in Oregon with a population of 374,748. With a total area of 4,772 square miles, Lane County is similar in size to the country of Trinidad and Tobago. Lane County is also one of just two counties in Oregon that stretch from the Pacific Ocean to the Cascade Mountains.

**\$15.8 Billion**

According to the Bureau of Economic Analysis, the Eugene Metro Statistical Area (Lane County) had a GDP of \$15.8 billion in 2017. The industries contributing the most to the GDP are professional and business services, financial activities, education and health services, trade, and construction.

## SECTOR STRATEGIES



Lane County is home to over 60 wood products manufacturing companies, which employ 3,360 people and bring over \$175 million in wages to the area. The industry's average wage of \$54,795 is significantly higher than the average Lane County wage of \$42,644. Employment growth is expected to be 5% over the next 10 years.



Lane County is home to over 167 food and beverage companies, which employ over 4,019 people and bring over \$179 million in wages to the area. The Food and Beverage Sector in Lane County is projected to grow by 795 additional jobs by the year 2027 for a 20% growth rate.



Lane County is home to over 450 tech companies, which employ 4,086 people and bring over \$304 million in wages to the area. The industry's local average annual wage is \$74,279 — nearly double the average Lane County wage of \$42,644. Employment growth is expected to be 23% over the next 10 years.



The median home in Lane County is \$221,000. In Eugene, this increases slightly to \$246,400, but is still far less than the median home prices in San Francisco (\$858,800) and Seattle (\$484,600).
